# How to Record an Ukulele At home!

# 1. USB Microphone

This easiest (and cheapest) way. You'll need a USB microphone (one that connects via the USB chord), an Ukulele, and a DAW (digital audio work stations).

For this method you simply plug the microphone into the USB, open your DAW, create an audio channel, select your USB input, and boom!

### 2. Direct Injection

Direct Injection, also known as DI, is where you will plug your ukulele into an audio interface directly with a cable.

To do this you will need an Ukulele that has a pick-up, a cable (1/8 inch), an audio interface and a DAW. First you will connect the chord to your Ukulele, after the other end to your audio interface. From there you will turn on your audio interface and open your DAW. Once in the DAW you will create an audio track, and you will then chose the correct channel for your Ukulele. If you have a tuner on your Ukulele make sure it is turned of, or sound will not go out of the pick up.

## 3. Mic'd up

This one is for the people who have a lovely Ukulele, but no pickup, or just prefer the sound of a warm microphone. To do this you will need an ukulele, XKR cables, an audio interface and a DAW. Connect the XLR cables to the microphone, after connect to your audio interface. From their you create an audio track for the microphone and you are good to go!

### 4. Mic'd up amp

You can do the same thing but instead of putting the microphone up to the Ukulele, you can actually put it up to an amplifier and run it through the amp as well. That way you can capture very specific tones and tasty sounds.
