


Clapton Style V to IV Blues Lick + Turnaround!


Today's lick of the week will be played over the V to IV chord change that occurs at the end of a 12 bar blues. Let's begin our practice session by reviewing the complete chord progression with a basic 8th note strumming pattern.




Now that you have memorized the basic 12 Bar Blues in E, let's learn how to play a variation of the minor blues scale that includes both the minor and major 3rds. This scale can be tranposed across all three chords of the 1.4.5 progression.
