INTRODUCTION

Hey everyone, it's Amy and in this tutorial, I'll be showing you how to paint weathered cloaks using the Skeleton Champion from the Warhammer Underworlds Sons of Velmorn Warband.

This tutorial will cover how to paint a weathered cape by building up layers, stippling and glazing.

The brushes I use for this are Rosemary & Co Series 33
Size #0 and Size #00 for the smallest details.

STEP 1

After priming the miniature with an airbrush using **Black Surface Primer** apply a basecoat of **Incubi Darkness** to the entire cape.



STEP 2

Using a mix of **Black** 1:1 **Incubi Darkness**, apply this as a glaze in to the recesses of the cape and towards the bottom where it would be naturally more in shadow.



STEP 3

Apply a highlight to most of the cape with a mix of **Incubi Darkness** 2:1 **Thunderhawk Blue**, leaving the recesses in shadow. Apply this in a rough manner to give the impression of a weathered appearance.



STEP 4

Using a mix of **Incubi Darkness** 1:1 **Thunderhawk Blue**, build up the highlight around all of the edges and on the raised surfaces of the cape.



STEP 5

Apply highlights to the edges and upper surfaces of the cape building up the effect with **Thunderhawk Blue**.



STEP 6

Edge highlight the edges of the cape in **Fenrisian Grey** and apply this as small scratches and dots with a stippling motion on the flat surfaces to create a weathered appearance.





STEP 7

Apply a glaze of Incubi Darkness to the entire cape to tie all of the previous layers together.



The cape is now complete. This tutorial has covered how to paint weathered cloaks utilising techniques such as stippling and glazing which can be applied to almost any miniature you choose.
