



Danny's fractured vertebra has obviously impacted his physical health significantly, but he has worked exceptionally hard with his physiotherapist, Blane Smith, and has far exceeded expectations for his recovery. Feedback from Blane states that Danny has continued to push himself hard and seems capable of withstanding great pain while tackling any obstacle that pops up.
