

# VISITING JAPAN: THE ULTIMATE TWO WEEK ITINERARY

Back in May two good friends from the UK came to visit me in Japan for a two week trip, in which I would be acting as their premium tour guide for the duration of the journey.

It was up to me to plan the destinations, hotels and hostels, as well as the means of transport to get us from Tokyo to Hiroshima, via Kyoto and Osaka, whilst trying to do it all for under £1,000. I knew that for my friends, this could potentially be a once in a lifetime trip, so I wanted to make sure they were able to see and do everything they possibly could, whilst avoiding that horrible rushed feeling that often comes from being too greedy and overfilling your holiday itinerary.

To my surprise, we were able to book and arrange all of the above for just £536 *(full breakdown of costs below)*, in large part thanks to a chain of excellent hostels and the use of night buses (although this meant sacrificing a good nights sleep twice). It was an amazing two weeks, meeting Asimo the robot, befriending a family of monkeys in Kyoto, standing before the atomic bomb dome in Hiroshima and exploring the world's biggest fish market in Tokyo.

Below you'll find a list of the original action-packed itinerary, including *accommodation*, *transportation*, *attractions* and a *full cost breakdown*. May it act as a useful blueprint for your trip to Japan someday.

#### Route: Tokyo -> Kyoto -> Osaka -> Hiroshima -> Tokyo

- Visit Sensoji Temple, Asakusa

- Chill in Asakusa neighbourhood and get over the ridiculous jet lag

Saturday - TOKYO Accommodation: Khaosan World, Asakusa

- Get an excellent view of Tokyo from Mori Tower in Roppongi
- Wander around Yoyogi Park and Meiji Shrine
- Explore Shibuya and Harajuku

#### Sunday - TOKYO Accommodation: Khaosan World, Asakusa

- Visit the future museum in Odaiba and see Asimo

- Try out an Onsen (hot spring) in Oedo Onsen, Odaiba


#### Monday - TOKYO
