
Rock Lead Lesson - Mastering Scales & Lick of the Week

Hello friends,

And welcome to another *Lick of the Week*. In today's lesson I'll be showing you how to play the **A position of the blues scale**, key of A. We'll put that useful scale to work with a **blues rock lick** that utilizes double bending, pull-offs and heavy vibrato. Let's get started!

1) The Am Blues Scale (A Position)

As I have covered in previous lessons, chords and scale patterns can be played in five different positions, this is called "CAGED theory." **Click here** for a full lesson on that subject.



Quick Tip: Always take the time to master a scale position before attempting to improvise. I recommend the follow practice method:

- Practice the scale in sections, first the E, A, D strings, then the G, B, and high E strings.
- Perform the scale at a slow tempo using a metronome, and gradually increase the speed.
- Take the time to memorize the note names, and also scale intervals. For blues guitar, it's extra important to memorize where the **root notes**, **4ths**, and **5ths** are located within the scale pattern.
- Once the pattern is memorized, practice playing it with syncopation.
- After many repetitions, it's time to practice playing the scale over a variety backing tracks. You'll know you have the scale down when you can perform it in every key, and over a wide-range of rhythms and tempos.
